

Refrigerators and freezers turned in for recycling must be in working condition (cooling), 10-30 cubic feet, owned by you and picked up from the residential address listed on the billing account. The credit will be applied to your electric account within 4-6 weeks after collection. Limit of two appliances per household per year.
